

NASP® Mission Statement

The National Archery in the Schools Program promotes instruction in international-style target archery as part of in-school curriculum, to improve educational performance and participation in the shooting sports among students in grades 4-12.

Requirements for Active NASP® School Status

All NASP® Schools must agree to comply with the NASP® Operating Principles.

NASP® lessons must be taught by a NASP® certified Basic Archery Instructor (for a minimum of 10 hours) during the school day, as a part of the in-class curriculum. Lessons taught outside of the normal school day or not in a class do not count as in-school lessons. In addition to strengthening our perfect safety record, the NASP® in-school requirement encourages schools to become a part of NASP®, enabling the safe introduction of archery for a greater number of students. The most common current delivery of the in-school NASP® lessons are provided in physical education classes; however, this is a local decision regarding where the lessons are provided.

In-school lessons should include students that are not part of a secondary after-school program. In most cases the number of students attending in-school lessons would be greater than the numbers for the after-school group.

Annual online reporting of in-school instructional hours and the number of students involved is mandatory for each NASP® school. Reporting is to be completed by the in-school BAI instructor(s) that presented/taught the in-school lessons at each NASP® school and is required to maintain an active BAI certification.
