The Official NASP® Score Card

Make sure to fill in squares **neat, dark and complete!** The number should be covered completely (no longer visible).

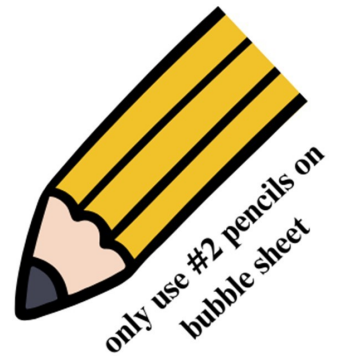
EACH END

Archer A initials box to say they agree with scores Archer B wrote down.

HOW TO SCORE:

1. Archer B will say and bubble in Archer A's arrow scores.
2. Archer A will then initial the box to say they agree.
3. Archer A will say and bubble Archer B's arrow scores on the second score card.
4. Archer B will then initial the box on their scorecard to say they agree.

If an archer does not agree, or a mistake is made, they raise their hand for a range official to make a final call and bring an eraser.



It is the archer's responsibility to make sure their score card is filled out correctly and can be read by computer. **Mismarks may be given the lower score or scored as a zero.**

MAKE SURE:

Archers bubble in their shooter number listed on the label.

Archer A signs as Archer
Archer B signs as witness
